#### You Are Welcome Here (le fin)

Today will be the final installment in this seven-part series on welcoming people into the church. My inspiration for this series came from <u>an article in The Atlantic</u> about why Americans have stopped going to church. If you want to catch up, you can find the earlier entries: <u>part 1</u>, <u>part 2</u>, <u>part 3</u>, <u>part 4</u>, <u>part 5</u>, and <u>part 6</u>.

My case rests on the shift from participation and attendance based on cultural Christianity toward a more transformative relationship with Jesus Christ and a family of Christ-followers. In recent years, I have been intentional about referring to us as Christ-followers instead of Christians. This is not because there is anything wrong with the tagline "Christian." It is a deliberate step away from the age of Christendom or Christian Empires. Jesus did not start a political party or attempt to organize a new religion. He was interested in God and people. As his followers, that is our priority too.

One practical step toward facilitating this shift in focus is changing our structure. During our 2024 Joint Administrative Review Committee (JARC), we can pray about moving to a more streamlined organizational structure (e.g., 12 Deacons, 12 members of Church Council, and 5 members of a Nominating Committee). The goal is to reduce the demand (or expectation) that people will fill slots on committees. A move like this liberates the church to focus on life-giving ministries.

The next part of welcoming people into our church family involves developing the way we do life together. Our future focus will continue to foster relationships and being a family of faith. Without any critique of where we are or where we've been in the past, we turn to the wisdom of Fred Rogers. In a 1994 interview with Charlie Rose, Mr. Rogers answered a question about how many children he thought he might have helped. He said, "We get so wrapped up in numbers in our society. The most important thing is that we are able to be one-to-one, you and I with each other at the moment. If we can be present to the moment with the person that we happen to be with, that's what's important."

As we follow Jesus, we turn from our culture's obsession with numbers. The most important thing isn't a thing. It is us: together. As we continue building this community of faith and love, the future will look different from the past, but it will include you and me. Together, we are God's family. We listen, talk, laugh, worship, eat, pray, love, sing, study, share ideas, cry, encourage, and so much more. When we feel welcome, and when we feel like we are part of the family, we can welcome others to join us.

I've truly enjoyed exploring the ideas I've shared over the last seven weeks in this space. I hope it has spoken to you, and I pray that we, as a church, can be even more welcoming in the future. My prayer is for us to be the kind of family of faith people long to experience. Together, we can make each person, when they enter this sacred space, feel God's presence and like they really matter. This is so important in a world with a loneliness epidemic, political divisions, and pain and suffering. Our family of faith can be a sanctuary of peace, a place to feel the love of Christ, and where we lift one another up in mutual support.


