## **Pick One Thing**

Last Sunday, we began our September series focusing on ecotheology with several ideas about how we relate to God and what we do with that relationship. We matter to God. In fact, everyone matters to God. Since the world is an intertwined, living breathing organism, we live out our love-of-our-neighbor when we take care of the world.

At the end of the service, during the invitation, I encouraged everyone to (1) plant something, and (2) go outside. It's been inspiring to hear the stories about what people have planted and how you've enjoyed God's beautiful world. Keep them coming! Hearing your stories encourages me. I hope you are also sharing your stories with one another. When we cheer each other on, we can inspire greater collective action. Through this collective action, we can make a difference.

Even if taking care of the environment is not a question for you, revisiting the reasons we focus on ecotheology helps us remember why we do it. Psalm 24:1 reminds us, "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it." Throughout scripture, we see reminders of this connection between God and the earth, yet humanity continues spoiling the planet. This summer, we have seen vivid reminders of the effects of climate change: wildfires in Hawaii, record high temperatures, and, most recently, the ferocity of Hurricane Idalia. Through our use of fossil fuels, deforestation, manufacturing processes, consumption of goods and services, and food production, we cause environmental disasters. So, "the earth is the Lord's", and we're wrecking it.
