A Spiritual Start to 2024

The 1970s pop group Abba has a song called "Happy New Year." The chorus goes: Happy New Year

Happy New Year

May we all have a vision now and then of a world where every neighbor is a friend

It may seem strange to invoke Abba as a point of departure for considering our start to the New Year, especially if we are doing it from a Christian perspective. However, their reference to "vision" makes me think about Joel 2:28, "Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions."

The verse from Joel is a powerful reminder of God's ability to move our hearts, no matter where we are or where we have been. The old year is over. The new one has just begun. As we start 2024, some might expect a minister to challenge everyone to, "Start the New Year right!"

But, what does that mean?

In our context, we prayerfully enter the New Year and try to hear what God is saying to us. We enter this time with faith that God still speaks. "Our sons and daughters can prophesy... we can dream dreams and see visions." The prophet's word for Israel can be our word. What is our vision for 2024? Can we enter the New Year with faith that God can give us a vision of friendship with our neighbors and our world? Can we be the salt and light this year in a new way?


