Being Baptist

Who are we? First, and foremost, we are Christ-followers. In Jesus, we share a common denominator with every other Christian. However, there are distinct characteristics among the various Christian traditions. For example, neither the Quakers nor the Salvation Army practice water baptism. There are other differences in other traditions, too. Some churches place bishop or other hierarchy over the local congregation. Some churches have parishes and parishioners instead of congregations and congregants like us. Some churches do not use instruments, and others prefer praise bands to pipe organs.

Some of the differences among congregations are theological, and others are stylistic. Even with theological differences, we still share a common denominator in Christ. But, learning more about who we are can help us appreciate some of the baptist distinctives. Baptist churches believe in the autonomy of the local church. There is no authority over us other than God. We are congregational in our polity. This means that the congregation is the ultimate authority over decisions within our church family.

As one of the Christian traditions born of the Reformation, we believe in *sola scriputra*, which means *only scripture*. In other words, we place a heavy emphasis on the role of the Bible in our spiritual formation. The Bible is ahead of tradition, history, and the whims of any individual. As a church, we find the training our ministers received useful for biblical interpretation, but this does not mean that ministers have any authority over congregants. Each person enjoys the priesthood of all believers and can go directly to God


