#### **More Boring Stuff**

Studying about our faith can be a bit like eating vegetables. I love learning more about God, and I really like eating vegetables. So, my tastes are not necessarily the norm. According to <u>a quick internet search</u>, cookies are the most popular snack in the U.S., followed by chips and ice cream as close second and third place finishers. Why not baby carrots or dried fruit?

The reason has to do with our desire for salt. According to a study from <u>The Journal of Clinical Investigation</u>, as we eat salty foods, we retain water. This leads to feeling hungry even after binging on a bag of potato chips. Another factor that contributes to favoring "comfort foods" over healthy treats is stress. I doubt anyone will argue that we do not live in stressful times (another election year, anyone?). According to a study from the <u>Journal of Health Psychology</u>, chronic stress leads to a desire for saltier junk food.

Last week, I wrote about being Baptist, and someone, using diplomatic euphemisms, told me it was boring. To which, I replied, "I understand." Studying about our faith, especially our tradition and how our tradition is distinct from some others, can feel like navel gazing or be boring. Yet, when we take the time to learn about what it means to claim the name University <u>Baptist</u> Church, we can better appreciate all that claim implies.

Keep the following in mind:

1) Being Baptist means that our congregation is autonomous. We do not answer to a bishop or presbyter. We

2) Being Baptist means that we are congregational. The church governs itself. For example, our upcoming Church Conference on February 7 will be when you get to decide our budget. The congregation is the ultimate arbiter for all UBC decisions.

3) Being Baptist means that we believe in the priesthood of all believers. No one can tell you what you must think. Each congregant can read scripture, study the tradition and history, and listen to the Holy Spirit to discern God's will. We are not creedal (meaning we don't have an official creed). We are confessional.

4) Being Baptist means that we profess believer's baptism. This means that we acknowledge each person's freedom to choose when and where to accept God's gift of grace and seek baptism, which we generally practice by immersion.

We spend much of our time focused on *what* God wants us to do. This leads us to give our attention to matters of justice and inclusion. We study the Bible, learn new hymns, worship, and pray. We also spend time studying ecotheology, food insecurity, racial reconciliation, and LGBTQ+ inclusion. All of these things are important. The proportion of our time spent on *how* we practice our faith instead of studying what we believe is probably balanced. However, to be who we are, we need the occasional reminder of what it means to be University <u>Baptist</u> Church.

#### PACEM at UBC begins this Saturday!

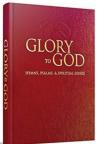
