Why Was Mark So Urgent?

On Sunday, part of the message emphasized the urgency in the gospel of Mark. After worship, I imagined someone asking a follow up question: what's the rush? The word we translate into English as "immediately" or "at once" occurs 35 times in Mark. That's almost half the occurrences in the New Testament. For example, Peter and Andrew "immediately" left their nets (Mark 1:18). Just after, Jesus went to the synagogue "immediately" (Mark 1:21). Later, after Jesus raised Jairus' daughter from the dead, she "immediately" stood up (Mark 5:41-42).

The urgency comes out of the importance of the message. Mark is the first of the four gospels to begin circulating. Both Matthew and Luke had access to Mark, and John comes from a different tradition and evolved over a period of time. Mark has a message. Everything relates back to "the good news of Jesus Christ, Son of God" (Mark 1:1).

In other words, the story says, "This is who Jesus is. Come and see. Be forever changed." Mark doesn't have time to waste. The urgency comes from excitement. Why not be in a hurry? Why not race ahead to the good news that God has come?

Part of the fast pace in Mark is a literary technique to convey significance. Beneath the text, the message repeats: Things keep happening and you (the reader) must keep up. All of this is so important that we don't have time to rest a while and think about the radical transformation Peter and Andrew experienced. What were they thinking? How did they feel? Mark doesn't give us literary space to

contemplate those questions. Instead, we can pause as we read, ask questions, pray for guidance, and listen to God speaking through each passage.

Pacing is up to us. When we pick up our Bibles, we can read slowly, repeating each word or phrase, like in *lectio divina*. Lectio divina is "holy reading" and part of the contemplative prayer practices. Or, when we pick up our Bibles, we can read rapidly and try to take in the overall picture. When we read through Mark at a faster pace, that's when we see the urgency.

Looking back and imagining everything happening in first -century Palestine in the years after Jesus' resurrection, the urgency could reflect the author's priorities. Mark might have scribbled the gospel quickly to get the message out. This is an important story, and there is no reason to delay telling it. So Mark wrote with a feeling of urgency, and that feeling comes through in the words.

The most important takeaway for us is to read the story, reflect on it, and let it shape our walk with Christ.


