Mustard Isn't the End

When Jesus compared faith to a mustard seed, he didn't say, "That's it. That's the end. You don't need anything else." He *did* say, "When the mustard seed is grown, it is the greatest of shrubs" (Matthew 13:31-32).

The seed is the start. It's where we begin our journey of growth. With a tiny amount of faith, we can take a step in God's direction. With only the smallest faith, we can begin following the way of Christ. With this small faith, our journey begins, and those first steps are when things get interesting.

"The greatest of shrubs" is our destination. When Corrie ten Boom began helping Jewish people during World War II, her courageous actions weren't the first step of faith. They reflected her faith having grown into "the greatest of all shrubs." The Nazis invaded the Netherlands in May 1940. Corrie and her family opened their home and hid Jewish people and members of the resistance. History celebrates her for heroic acts of faith. However, long before they risked their lives to help people, they had been growing in faith. The mustard seed was planted, germinated, and, by 1940, was fully grown.

Too often, we try to start with the destination. We hear what a Christ-follower should be doing, and it seems like we should be doing that, too. Maybe we should. Or maybe that's not where we are on our journey. We must begin from where we are. Sometimes, we start with a tiny movement of faith (a mustard seed). Then, we let it grow and

see what God does with it. "For God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).

Corrie ten Boom once said, "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God." We don't know the future, so we enter each day and live in faith. Our calling is to muster the smallest amount of faith—faith like a mustard seed—and let it grow. God goes with us and will shine through us. Even if we have to plant a hundred mustard seeds, God will keep blessing them and nurturing them.


