Getting Ready for Ken

I cannot remember being this excited about Lent and Holy Week before. During Lent, on Wednesday nights, we are going to study Growing Young from the Fuller Youth Institute. It lists six strategies for helping young people discover and love our church. This book might help us reinvigorate our ministries to young people. On Sundays, we are going to use the "Wandering Heart" resources from Sanctified Art. This will take us on a Lenten journey through Peter's eyes. I really like the tagline: "Figuring out faith with Peter."

"Growing Young" and "Wandering Heart" are both going to be wonderful tools as we walk through Lent. But the REALLY exciting part of this season will be when we host the blind pianist and singer Ken Medema as our special guest musician during Holy Week and Easter.

Ken was born with a visual impairment and spent a lot of time alone as a child. Music changed his life. He writes, "I started banging on the piano when I was five years old, making up crazy little pieces on my mom's piano." He went on to study music therapy at Michigan State, earning both bachelor's and master's degrees. After college, he began writing music.

In 1971, he recorded an album called Fork in the Road. The title track is the perfect song for Spy Wednesday. It's about the choice Judas had to make, and it captures the spirit behind our Holy Week stop on Spy Wednesday. During Holy Week 2023, Rev. Deal and I were talking about music for this tricky worship service. I suggested that we

perform Ken's song "Fork in the Road" in 2024. The light went on, and we realized that having Ken come and participate in our Holy Week and Easter worship services could be an amazing revival for UBC.

Ken and his wife Jane have been married since 1965 and live in the San Francisco Bay area. Rev. Deal took her youth choir there and spent a week with Ken in 2016. She told me that the experience transformed the group, and they came back inspired.

Ken performed a concert at UBC in 1984. We found the case for the recording of the concert, but the tape is missing.



The Kittie Colvin Trail Circle will be collecting items for AIM (the Alliance of Interfaith Ministries). AIM is requesting basic items not covered by SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). SNAP covers only food. On your next shopping trip please pick up an extra item or two from the list below. Also, as you clean out your linen closet; bed linens, pillows, towels, and wash clothes are always needed. Collection boxes will be located in the first-floor lobby.

The Alliance for Interfaith Ministries is a 501c3 tax-exempt charitable nonprofit organization whose primary purpose is to help residents of Albemarle County and Charlottesville attain self-sufficiency and stability. They help local residents navigate the "safety net" of social programs in our area, and directly through AIM programs such as housing stability assistance, eviction prevention, utility assistance and disconnection prevention, and crisis assistance.
