Before God's Love

Before we know about God's love, we learn about human love. Think about how you came to your life of faith. Did it happen in the abstract? Of course not. Each one of us learned about Jesus from another person or a group of people. The imprint these people made on your life shaped the kind of Christ-follower you are today.

When we think about sharing God's love with a new generation, it's easy to skip the first part: human love. According to research from the Barna Group, almost half of practicing Christian millennials say evangelism is wrong. The study suggests that they feel like people will take offense if they share their faith. The Pew Research Center found that 28% of U.S. adults are religiously unaffiliated, describing themselves as atheists, agnostics, or "nothing in particular" when asked about their religion.

Against this landscape of ambivalence or hostility, we cannot skip the first step in sharing about God's love. We must love people where they are. Part of following Jesus means working out how we hear the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) and apply it to our lives. Jesus never told his followers to be disrespectful or disregard someone's belief system. He loved people where they were. Likewise, to follow him, we must love people where they are. When we do, we share human love, and through this love, with the movement of the Holy Spirit, they can learn about God's love.

In Matthew, some Sadducees tried to trap Jesus with a question about the resurrection (Matthew 22:23-33).

He responded by re-situating their question to apply to life right now. In other words, he said, "Let's get things straight here before we worry about what's next." They didn't have an answer, because they weren't trying to grow or learn. They wanted to win. Jesus' response was an attempt to show them the flaw in their logic, and they didn't like it.

Some Pharisees saw the encounter and took a swing at trapping Jesus. They asked, "What's the greatest commandment?" Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets" (Matthew 22:34-40).

Everything comes back to love. Love God. Love your neighbor. Love people where they are, not where we (or God) want them to be. When we do, we are sharing God's love.
