ON WATCH

You Are Welcome (Redux)

In October and November 2023, I wrote a seven-part 'On Watch' series titled "You Are Welcome" ([part 1](#), [part 2](#), [part 3](#), [part 4](#), [part 5](#), [part 6](#), and [part 7](#)). I began the series by citing [an article from The Atlantic](#) about reasons millions of people have stopped going to church. The biggest reason people don't attend worship services is the structure of American life in the twenty-first century. Week after week, I kept pushing the question: when we say, "You are welcome," what do we mean?

We can take our answers in many directions. Some people might interpret the question to mean welcoming those who have been hurt by church in the past. Others draw the conclusion that welcoming means keychain leadership (which is a concept we've been exploring on Wednesday nights). At the conclusion of my previous series, I suggested considering a structural change to help us focus more on being a family of faith and less on being an institution. The goal was to strip away some of our remaining layers of bureaucracy while retaining the ability to operate God's church.

My proposal sounded radical to some, and I can understand why. However, my goal is to build God's kingdom and create space for our church family to follow the Holy Spirit. It's about being born of the Spirit and deemphasizing earthly concerns.

We welcomed Kevin Adams into membership during worship on Sunday, April 7. When you see Kevin, take a moment to welcome him into our family of faith.

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit" (John 3:6). Each of us has internal tension between *our* world and *God's* world. If a church is "born of the flesh," it will reflect the flesh. In other words, when being an institution takes more of our attention than being God's family, we, like Nicodemus, miss Jesus' point. He says, "You must be born again," and we repeat Nicodemus' question, "How can that be?"

Instead of asking why people stopped going to church, we could ask why they started. Were they part of the movement toward cultural Christianity stemming from the Great Awakening? If so, did they experience transformation in Christ, or did they go to church because that's just what people did? These questions are not meant to judge, but to enlighten. If someone never experienced transformation, then we have no reason to expect them to continue showing up?

When we say, "You are welcome," we mean, God says, "Here is your life. You might never have been, but you *are*, because the party wouldn't have been complete without you. Here's the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Don't be afraid. I am with you. Nothing can ever separate us. It's for you I created the universe. I love you" (*Wishful Thinking* by Frederick Buechner, p. 39).

How do we live out the radical, inclusive love of Christ?
