Who Did You Invite? **SWATCH**

When Jesus began his ministry, he gathered his first followers by inviting them to follow him. Those first respondents to the invitation said, "Yes," and they became his disciples. In turn, they invited others. After Jesus encountered the woman at the well, according to John 4:39, "Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman's testimony."

How far have we come from this invitational culture? How has the confluence of the political term "Evangelical" and conservative culture clouded how we share the gospel? Instead of telling others, "Come and see," we lean into ideas like, "Live and let live." Too often, sharing God's graces seems like an affront to someone else's belief structure.

Sharing the good news about Jesus isn't about proselytizing people to our brand of beliefs. Any conviction experienced by anyone is the result of the work of the Holy Spirit. We do not convert people from one belief system to ours. God is the progenitor of faith in Jesus Christ.

In one sense, this lets us off the hook. If we don't need to convert anyone, we don't need to worry about the results. In another sense, as God's hands and feet, we have a responsibility to share what we believe. This is where Jesus' invitation gets interesting. Are we his followers? Do we accept our role as members of the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:27)?

steps to serve the ice cream. This is a very popular outreach ministry of the church.

As his followers and members of the body of Christ, what do we do?

This line of questioning leads to considering the most meaningful part of your faith. If church is more of a social club and less of a family of faith, then it might make sense to invite others who enjoy the same social aspects of church. In fact, if church is a gathering place for cultural Christians, then inviting people to *our* club instead of one of the other clubs (churches) can make sense. We can say, "Oh, if you like to sing, then you should join *our* choir. It's better than *that* choir." But it's not a club.

As a family of faith, we are a people who are transformed in the likeness of Christ. The invitation, whether explicit or implicit, is to join us on the journey of transformation. This is a harder invitation than a simple cultural gathering or club. However, this is the invitation Jesus gave to his first followers, and it's the invitation he extends to us today.

Before we invite another, we should ask ourselves if we've accepted Jesus' invitation to us. If the answer is yes, then we can return to the question about the most life-giving part of our faith. As we think about the lifegiving part of faith, we can pray for God to open doors for us to share it with others. If we utter that prayer, God will answer it and open the door to invite others to drink from the well of living water.
