# Standing Against NWATCH

On Saturday evening, someone fired a gun at a political rally, and a bullet hit a well-known politician and several rally participants. The gunman killed one person and injured two others. The first question that came to my mind was: Will these events finally prompt some action against gun violence? The second question is deeper: What would Jesus call us to do in the face of so many forms of violence in our world today?

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9). Our calling is to be peacemakers in a violent world, and there is violence all around us. Some of it is big, like people shooting other people, including in our own neighborhoods. Other violence is small or distant, like the cumulation of all of the actions we (humanity) take to attack God's wonderful world.

When we extend Jesus' calling beyond explicit violence between people, we can see the great need for Christ in the world. One person's violent act is easy to identify and isolate. We can respond by saying, "This needs to stop," or we can intercede and try to stop the violence. However, when we look around and see all of the forms of violence, we have work to do.

In Parker Palmer's 2018 book *On the Brink of Everything*, he writes, "Violence is what happens when we don't know what else to do with our suffering." There's a lot of pain in the world, and

# Did You Walk Six Miles Uphill in the Snow to School?

Some of you will remember the days when gathering school supplies meant stopping by the neighborhood drug store and asking for an empty cigar box to use as a pencil box. Now the

economy is different. Teachers are underpaid and many are spending their own money to buy needed classroom supplies. School budgets are stretched to the max. School supplies, that previously had been provided by the school system, are no longer in the budget. This coming school year 85% of Woodbrook Elementary School's 550 students will qualify for the free or reduced-price lunch program. Most families simply cannot afford to spend \$50 per child on basic school supplies to begin the school year. Through the month of July, the money you donate to the Woodbrook School Supplies Project will allow the WMU (Woman's Missionary Union) to purchase school supplies that are requested by the school's Family Support Workers. They will then give the needed supplies to economically disadvantaged children. Please make your checks or online donations payable to UBC and earmark "school supplies."
